

Flash backs

 $1\vert$ The brass splashback in this kitchen by Michael Collins Architects was made using off-cuts from exterior cladding, which was then aged by hand using bleach and other household chemicals. It reflects the light from the glass ceiling above, 'creating a lovely, sunny glow', says Michael. It is set off by the glossy red mid-century-style wall lights and flatfronted units painted in Farrow & Ball's 'Inchyra Blue'.  $2 \mid$ Interior designer Clare Gaskin has extended the Venato Black marble work surface onto the wall to form an eyecatching backdrop with an integrated shelf. This works well with the fluted-front island in dark stained oak.  $3 \mid A$ considered use of colour creates impact in the home of artist Natasha Mann. She worked with kitchen specialist Pluck to achieve her desired look, opting for its units with handleless doors in wood and coloured finishes.
